

The Main Guard is a historic, 18th-century guardhouse in the British Overseas Territory of Gibraltar. While the exact date of its construction is unknown, it is the oldest building in John Mackintosh Square.

Works include:

- Demolishing of the existing floors on the ground floor to hallways and patio
- Installing new sewage channels and manholes
- Construction of buildings to the patio as per original design of the building
- Demolishing of the entrance of the building as per original design of the building
- Hacking and rendering the complete front façade of the building, including exposing the original lime stone features on the corners of the building
- Installing new railings, gates and lamps as per original design of the building
- Hacking and rendering of the existing walls on the inside
- Painting to the complete inside and outside of the building including doors, windows, ceilings
- Installing new Oak floors to the ground floor, including varnishing
- Installing York- stone paving to hallways ground floor and to stairs and balcony first floor
